- Identify the ethical challenges and potential conflicts in determining
  the ideal prenatal test for a couple given the recent expansion of
  prenatal testing options. Differentiate between non-directive genetic
  counseling and providing technically accurate information about the
  advantages and limitations of new prenatal tests.
